The issues facing New Hampshire's children and families are complex.

New Hampshire families are experiencing significant financial pressure.

- Real family median income has decreased by 10 percent in five years.
- Child poverty has increased by more than 50 percent, with one out of ten children living in poverty.
- Nearly 1,000 of our children are homeless.

In education, local data reveals both disparity and barriers to opportunity.

- Test scores suggest that New Hampshire is currently failing to meet the educational needs of at least one-quarter (50,000) of our school-aged children.
